


**Our purpose:** Faith Lutheran Church exists to share with all, God's love through Christ and His promise of salvation!

When we face persecution and hard times for our faith, just like Jeremiah did, we can take comfort knowing that unlike the theology of glory, the Lord wishes to show Himself to us even in the midst of difficulties and struggles. Even though we may struggle in this life, the Lord promises to rescue us from them.
